

Student Resource Scheme 2024

Bellbird Park State Secondary College proudly offers a Student Resource Scheme which is endorsed by the school's Parent & Citizens Association and complies with the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (QLD).

The school is financed largely by the State Government to meet the costs associated with the provision of instruction, facilities and administration for the education of all students. Parents/carers do not contribute to the provision of these basic services. This provision is commonly referred to as 'free education'.

Under the above act, A *parent* is directly responsible for providing a student with textbooks and other resources for a student's use while attending school. As a cost effective and efficient approach to assist parents with the price of these educational resources, Bellbird Park State Secondary College offers an alternative to purchasing textbooks, resources, consumables and/or materials from elsewhere, through reduced prices gained from the school's bulk purchasing processes.

Benefits:

- Reduced financial costs for parents in providing an extensive range of student resources
- Eliminates shopping for textbooks and resources
- Provides student access to a wide range of latest resources
- Supplements consumable resources to provide real life learning experiences for our students
- Supports maintenance of technology

Our students will be encouraged along many pathways with no limits. They will be in a learning environment that encourages, empowers and educates them to prepare them for a highly competitive environment after they graduate. All monies raised through this scheme are expended directly on the students of the school on an annual basis.

How it works:

- Enter into a written agreement (*Participation Agreement Form*) in return for payment of an annual participation fee which will be due and payable in February of each year
- Agreed payment arrangements available
- Scheme is voluntary
- Student Resource Scheme payments must be up to date for a student to participate in any extra-curricular activities such as inter-school sport, excursions, incursions or camps.
- A parent who does not wish to join the scheme is responsible for providing their student with the items that would otherwise have been provided to the student by the scheme.
 Parents who choose not to participate in the scheme will receive the textbook and resource allowance directly from the school.

• Payment of the participation fee by the parent is a requirement for continued participation in the scheme. An unpaid fee will be subject to the school's debt recovery processes.

Clarification of costs to enhance your student's learning experience:

- Student ID Card (Photo) for external use
- All approved textbooks (including eTextbooks) for each subject on a loan basis
- Use of class sets of general reading books including atlas's and dictionaries
- Use of reference materials including CD software programs and on-line programs
- Administration of the scheme
- Equipment hire e.g. digital cameras and audio visual equipment
- Teacher prepared booklets / worksheets
- Reproduced class materials which compliment textbooks or substitute for textbooks
- Sport uniform for school teams
- Computer Technology (ICT) and technical support (IT)

These resources are provided on loan. Students are expected to take due care of all items and to return them in a condition similar to that in which they were issued, on completion of a unit of study or upon leaving the school.

Some of the subject specific benefits included in the scheme:

- Access and provision of textile articles, food demonstrations and food items for cooking
- Access to gloves, aprons and protective eyewear, provision of chemicals, electronic components and consumables for group/experimental work in Science, Chemistry, Biology and Physics
- Projects completed in art, paint, craft, adhesives, drawing, screen printing, clay and ceramics and specialist art equipment
- Projects completed in Manual Arts, access to safety equipment
- Access to musical equipment for music subjects
- Access to sporting equipment

Items specifically excluded from the Resource Scheme under the Act:

- Laptop hire
- School activities, such as school excursions, camps and formals. Individual payments can be made for these activities as they occur.
- Bus hire to excursions & weekly sporting fixtures

- School Magazine and School Photos
- Voluntary contributions to supplement the instruction, administration and facilities provided at the school
- Elective Subject Levy

CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

The following conditions apply to the Student Resource Scheme:

- The Student ID Card is used by students in the daily operation of the school e.g. borrowing books from the Textbook Room or the Library and photocopying. If lost, replacements will be at cost price.
- Students may be responsible for the full cost of books and resources that are negligently damaged or lost before any further issues can be made.
- The office should be immediately notified of the loss of any textbook or resource.
- All overdue resources issued to student/s must be returned or replaced before any resources will be issued in the current year.
- All scheme monies received by the school will be banked in the school's general account, which is subject to annual audit.
- If a student starts at the school after first term, the fee is reduced on a pro-rata basis.
- If a student leaves the school having paid the charge, a pro-rata refund will be made. The refund is based on the full charge being government Allowance and parent/caregiver charge, less the cost of consumed materials and/or the cost of replacing lost or damaged textbooks.
- The Principal may refuse to admit a student to the scheme if there are hire payments overdue from the previous year.
- **Student Resource Scheme fees must be up to date** before any of the non-curriculum electives can be paid for. Non-curriculum electives must be paid in full and permission forms returned to the Finance Office prior to attendance or collection
